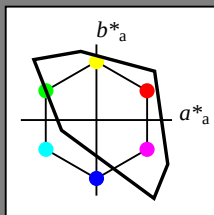


Input: Colorimetric Television Luminous System TLS00a

0 0 1 = Blue B

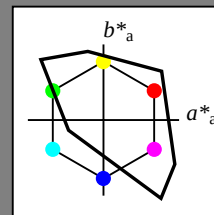

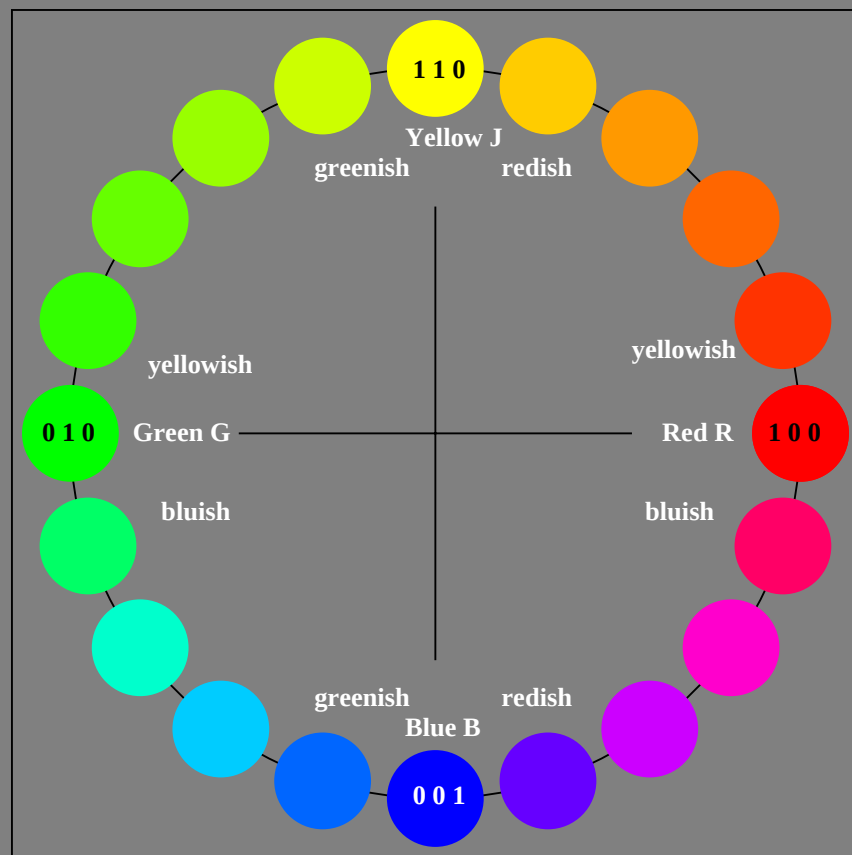

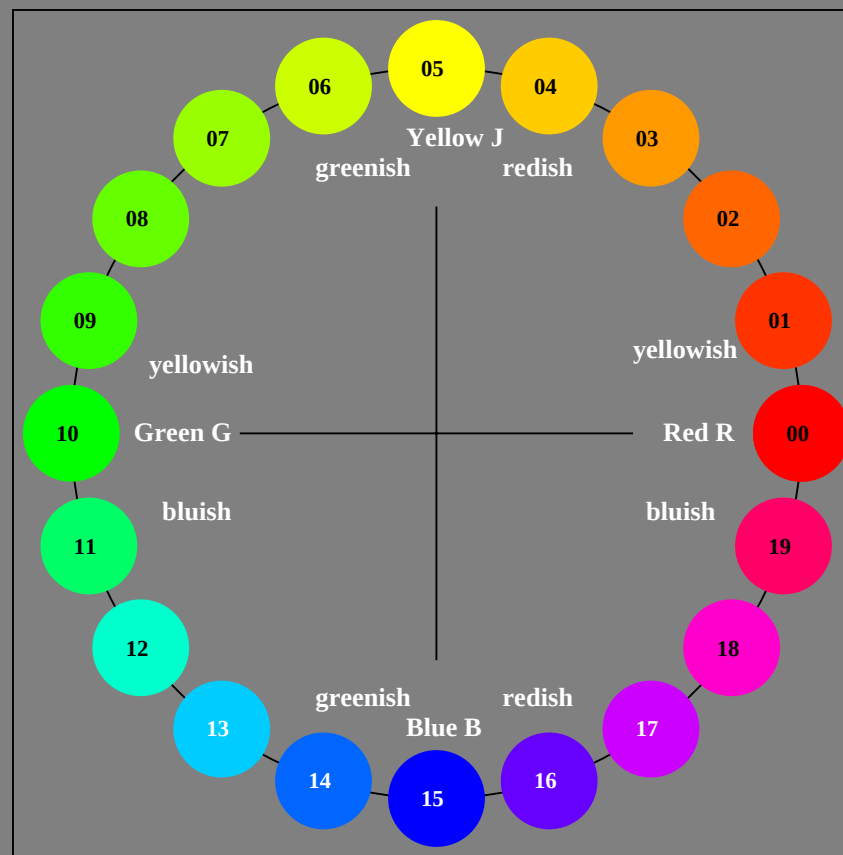
